Rationale

While not new, the concept of nursing-sensitive health outcomes is now becoming particularly relevant. Understanding the impact of each discipline or profession on the health and well-being of people is a necessity in periods of economic constraints.

Society moved from the enshrinement of health professionals, whose decisions were indisputable, to their accountability. They need to be held responsible for what they do and why they do it, the potential outcomes of their actions and, ultimately, the associated costs.

Research shows that health care has entered the age of "accountability", which is visible through the increasing number of studies on effectiveness and health care outcomes.

In addition to the complexity associated to care and to care provision settings, the myriad of opinions on what to measure also challenges the still complex process of measuring the impact of nursing care on people. However, the more data we collect on care and its impact, the greater the possibilities of providing effective quality care.

The Pediatric Hospital is part of the Coimbra Hospital and University Centre.

It has been granted university status through a protocol signed with the Faculty of Medicine of the University of Coimbra, and is innovative in diverse areas of pediatrics. Throughout the years, it has proven to be a very prestigious unit of assistance and a centre of national reference in terms of the pediatric treatment of complex or rare pathologies.

The premises where it was located up until recently were used for many different purposes throughout history: first it was a convent, later on an asylum for the blind and the cripple, and then a hospital-sanatorium for women and children with tuberculosis. When its mission in this area of care came to an end, and after going through significant difficulties, the reconversion and adaptation of the building into a hospital for children happened in June 1977.

The new building of the Pediatric Hospital, which was recently inaugurated, has distinct areas to care for younger children and teenagers up to the age of 18, and provides for a population of 500 000 users.

Telemedicine, especially associated to pediatric cardiology, is widely expanding in the Community of Portuguese-speaking Countries.

It started operating in a building that was built for this effect, and also provided Social Care with a boarding school for children at risk, a nursery school and a kindergarten. At the time, Bissaya Barreto wanted to organize a maternal-child assistance institution where one could find a balance between the "scientific spirit, the social spirit and the spirit of charity...", as was expected in a hospital prepared for the future.

Located on the right bank of the river, the Maternity Hospital Bissaya Barreto is part of the Maternal and Child Referral Network, and it is a hospital which provides both perinatal support and differentiated perinatal support.

A Música é parte essencial deste SER, orgulhando-se a Orquestra Clássica do Centro de, ao longo da sua existência, ter associado a Música aos Monumentos da Cidade, no que entendemos ser uma das formas mais positivas de afirmar Coimbra. "Em Memória da Madrugada (em Coimbra)" - é o título do último Cd da OCC e que a título de curiosidade, foi gravado no dia em que foi conhecida a decisão da UNESCO, de classificar a Cidade de Coimbra como Património Mundial. Este é, no entanto, também um dos temas que vamos poder ouvir no concerto a realizar no dia 23 em Coimbra, no auditório dos Hospitais da Universidade de Coimbra. As orquestras têm o particular encanto de difundir e internacionalizar compositores, obras e interpretes, sendo também estes naturalmente um dos objectivos desta orquestra. A OCC é uma orquestra profissional residente na cidade de Coimbra, composta por 32 músicos tendo como maestro titular, David Wyn Lloyd. Neste concerto, tal como no Cd, teremos a participação do Dejan Ivanovic na guitarra clássica.

Vamos poder ouvir a interpretação de obras destacando-se, neste programa, compositores Portugueses, Espanhóis ou Brasileiros. A Orquestra Clássica do Centro (OCC) apresentou-se pela primeira vez, enquanto orquestra profissional, em Dezembro de 2001, na altura com 25 elementos e com a denominação de Orquestra de Câmara de Coimbra. Considerada de superior interesse cultural pelo Ministério da Cultura, a OCC encontra-se abrangida, desde então, pela Lei do Mecenato Cultural (atual Estatuto dos Benefícios Fiscais). Em 2002, a Orquestra passou a ser composta por 32 elementos, sendo esta a sua atual constituição. Já em 2004 viu aprovada por unanimidade, em Assembleia-Geral, a alteração do nome para Orquestra Clássica do Centro. Do seu historial destacam-se os concertos que tiveram lugar em monumentos arquitectónicos da cidade e concelho de Coimbra, no âmbito do projeto Mo(nu)mentos Musicais (2003) e o alargamento da sua atividade a câmaras e distritos mais diferenciados. Passou ainda a contar com o contributo solístico e de regência de notáveis figuras do nosso panorama musical, encontrando também meios para, pontualmente, produzir concertos com uma densidade tímbrica e orquestral sinfónica. Também tem vindo a multiplicar a actuação de formações de câmara (trios, quartetos e quintetos, entre outras), disponibilizando assim um leque variado de programas/repertórios, em função das circunstâncias/local dos eventos. Organizou concursos e conferências, para além das atividades exclusivamente concertísticas. Ao longo destes treze anos, a OCC tem realizado o seu trabalho ininterruptamente, procurando levar a música erudita a toda a Região Centro e noutros locais do País, do Minho ao Algarve, colaborando com diversas entidades a nível regional, local, profissional, etc. O historial da OCC inclui diversas iniciativas realizadas sobre a temática da Guitarra e Canção de Coimbra,



nomeadamente concertos em espaços monumentais, com a guitarra como instrumento solista. O tratamento orquestral da canção de Coimbra, o Festival Cantar Coimbra, ou os Encontros Internacionais da Guitarra Portuguesa, com o Patrocínio da Caixa Geral de Depósitos, iniciados em 2007, são a cabal prova disso. Em 2013, com a autoria das compositoras Marina e Natália Pikoul apresentou, em estreia no Festival das Artes, a Ópera "Os Sinos da Macieira".

Em Maio de 2014, deslocou-se a Cabo Verde, a convite do Ministro da Cultura de Cabo Verde Mário Lúcio de Sousa que declarou a Orquestra, além de "fundadora da Orquestra Nacional de Cabo Verde", como sendo parte integrante desta, tendo ainda atribuído o título de "Maestro Honorário Vitalício da Orquestra Nacional de Cabo Verde" ao maestro titular e diretor artístico da OCC David Lloyd. O concerto inaugural teve lugar na cidade da Praia, assinalando também o Dia Mundial da Diversidade Cultural. Por proposta do Ministro Mário Lúcio de Sousa, a OCC irá acolher em Coimbra o Centro de Transcrição da criação musical de Cabo Verde. Editou vários CD's, dos quais se destacam "Cantar Coimbra 1 e 2" ou a Suite Sinfónica Aeminium do compositor José Firmino. Em 2013 edita o CD "Em Memória da Madrugada (em Coimbra)" com obras de Debussy, de Delius e de Marina Pikoul com a participação do solista Dejan Ivanovic.

Enquanto associação, a OCC tem ainda a responsabilidade de gestão cultural do Pavilhão Centro de Portugal (local da sede da OCC). Fomentar a cultura musical, dimensionar a vertente pedagógica e conferir apetência para ouvir e apreciar música erudita, têm sido e continuarão a ser os objectivos deste projeto.

A Orquestra Clássica do Centro conta com o apoio Institucional da Câmara Municipal de Coimbra, e tem como Mecenass plurianuais a Caixa Geral de Depósitos e a EFAPEL. Tem ainda o apoio da Universidade de Coimbra, do IPC, do ISCAC, do Diário As Beiras, do Diário de Coimbra, além de empresas como a Critical Software, a ISA ou a ASCENDUM.

Maestro David Wyn Lloyd, doutorado pela Universidade de Sheffield, em Inglaterra, iniciou os seus estudos superiores em 1981, no Royal College of Music, Londres. Durante o período em que frequentou esta escola ganhou vários prémios para viola d'arco e música de câmara. Prosseguiu os seus estudos com Peter Schidlöf, do Quarteto Amadeus, e participou em Masterclasses, na Cornualha. Tem tido uma carreira profissional intensa, tocando com as principais orquestras de Londres, colaborando em cinema e televisão e assinando várias gravações. David Lloyd foi membro da BBC Symphony Orchestra durante quatro anos. Durante a sua estadia em Londres tocou com vários maestros, entre os quais Klaus Tennstedt, Christoph von Eschenbach, Bernard Haitink, Pierre Boulez, Sir John Pritchard, Vladimir Ashkenazy, Zubin Mehta, Günter Wand, Sir Simon Rattle, Guisepppe Sinopoli, Sir Andrew Davis, Sir Colin Davis, Gennady Rozhdestvensky, Alexander Lazarev e Esa-Pekka Salonen, entre outros. Lloyd tocou em palcos de grande prestígio como o Albert Hall, Festival Hall, Barbican Centre (Londres), Berliner Philharmonie e Concertgebouw, Ópera (Paris), La Scala, Musikverein e Gewandhaus. É desde Abril de 2012 o maestro titular e director artístico da Orquestra Clássica do Centro. Na sequência da deslocação da OCC a Cabo Verde, foi-lhe atribuído pelo Ministro da Cultura daquele país o título de "Maestro Honorário Vitalício da Orquestra Nacional de Cabo Verde".

É o vencedor do 1º Prémio e Prémio especial para Melhor Interpretação da Música Espanhola no 13º Concurso Internacional de Guitarra "Doña Infanta Cristina" em Madrid (1998); 1º Prémio do 3º Concurso Internacional de "Sinaia 98" na Roménia; 1º Prémio do 17º Certamen Internacional de Guitarra "Andrés Segovia" em Herradura (2001); 1º Prémio e Prémio do Público no 35º Certamen Internacional de Guitarra "Francisco Tarrega" em Benicàssim (2001); 1º Prémio do 4º Concurso Internacional de Creta, "Arhanes 2005". Shrine of Fatima:

On 13th May 1917, three children were pasturing their little flock in the Cova da Iria, parish of Fatima, town of Vila Nova de Ourém, today the diocese of Leiria-Fatima. They were called: Lucia de Jesus, aged 10, and her cousins Francisco and Jacinta Marto, aged 9 and 7.

About midday, after praying the Rosary, as was their custom, they were amusing themselves building a little house of stones scattered around the place where the Basilica now stands. Suddenly they saw a brilliant light, and thinking it to be lightning, they decided to go home. But as they went down the slope another flash lit up the place, and they saw on the top of a holmoak (where the Chapel of Apparitions now stands), "a Lady more brilliant than the sun", from whose hands hung a white rosary.

The Lady told the three little shepherds that it was necessary to pray very much, and she invited them to return to the Cova da Iria during five consecutive months, on the 13th day and at that hour. The children did so and on the 13th day of June, July, September and October, the Lady appeared to them again and spoke to them in the Cova da Iria. On the 19th of August, the apparition took place at Valinhos, about 500 meters from Aljustrel, because on the 13th the children had been carried off by the local Administrator to Vila Nova de Ourém.

At the last apparition, on October 13th, with about 70,000 people present, the Lady told them that she was the "Lady of the Rosary" and that a chapel was to be built there in her honour. After the apparition all present witnessed the miracle promised to the three children in July and September: the sun, resembling a silver disc, could be gazed at without difficulty and, whirling on itself like a wheel of fire, it seemed about to fall upon the earth.

Afterwards, when Lucia was a Religious Sister of Saint Dorothy, Our Lady appeared to her again in Spain (10th December 1925 and



15th February 1926, in the Convent of Pontevedra, and on the night of 13th/14th June 1929, in the Convent of Tuy), requesting the devotion of the five first Saturdays (to pray the Rosary, meditate on the mysteries of the Rosary, confess and receive Holy Communion, in reparation for the sins committed against the Immaculate Heart of Mary), and the Consecration of Russia to the same Immaculate Heart. This request had been announced by the Apparition on 13th July 1917, in what is called the "Secret of Fatima". Years later, Sr. Lucia related that, between April and October of 1916, an Angel had appeared to the three seers on three occasions, twice in the Cabeço and once at the well in the garden behind Lucia's house, who exhorted them to prayer and penance. Since 1917 pilgrims have not ceased to come to the Cova da Iria in thousands upon thousands from all parts of the world, at first on the 13th of each month, later during the summer and winter holidays, and now more and more at weekends and any day all the year round, with an annual number of five million people.

Batalha Monastery:
(Official website)

Classified as World Heritage since 2007 by UNESCO, the Batalha Monastery, or Convent of Santa Maria da Vitória, is one of the most magnificent architectural jewels in Portugal, and it is also the most significant symbol of the Avis Dynasty.

King João I, Master of Avis, ordered that it be built in thanksgiving for the victory in the Battle of Aljubarrota which ended the difficult crisis of 1383-85, and construction began in 1388, led by Master Afonso Domingues.

Nowadays, the Batalha Monastery is the main final Gothic monument in Portugal and the first one where the "Manueline Art" was applied.

In 1402, the Flaming Gothic influence emerged with Master Huguet who was put in charge of the Monastery's construction work, which brought a breath of fresh air to the structure with the beginning of the construction of the Chapter House's vault, the Founder's Chapel and the Unfinished Chapels (king D. Duarte's pantheon).

Later on, the D. Afonso V Cloister was built (by Fernão de Évora) and the cloister's galleries were closed.

The Monastery's construction was interrupted abruptly, possibly due to the construction of other important monuments, such as the Belém Monastery, and it was only given the proper restoration attention around 1840, when much conservation and restoration work was begun, which lasted many years.

The children did so and on the 13th day of June, July, September and October, the Lady appeared to them again and spoke to them in the Cova da Iria. On the 19th of August, the apparition took place at Valinhos, about 500 meters from Aljustrel, because on the 13th the children had been carried off by the local Administrator to Vila Nova de Ourém.

At the last apparition, on October 13th, with about 70,000 people present, the Lady told them that she was the "Lady of the Rosary" and that a chapel was to be built there in her honour. After the apparition all present witnessed the miracle promised to the three children in July and September: the sun, resembling a silver disc, could be gazed at without difficulty and, whirling on itself like a wheel of fire, it seemed about to fall upon the earth.

Afterwards, when Lucia was a Religious Sister of Saint Dorothy, Our Lady appeared to her again in Spain (10th December 1925 and 15th February 1926, in the Convent of Pontevedra, and on the night of 13th/14th June 1929, in the Convent of Tuy), requesting the devotion of the five first Saturdays (to pray the Rosary, meditate on the mysteries of the Rosary, confess and receive Holy Communion, in reparation for the sins committed against the Immaculate Heart of Mary), and the Consecration of Russia to the same Immaculate Heart. This request had been announced by the Apparition on 13th July 1917, in what is called the "Secret of Fatima".

Years later, Sr. Lucia related that, between April and October of 1916, an Angel had appeared to the three seers on three occasions, twice in the Cabeço and once at the well in the garden behind Lucia's house, who exhorted them to prayer and penance.

Since 1917 pilgrims have not ceased to come to the Cova da Iria in thousands upon thousands from all parts of the world, at first on the 13th of each month, later during the summer and winter holidays, and now more and more at weekends and any day all the year round, with an annual number of five million people.

Batalha Monastery:

Classified as World Heritage since 2007 by UNESCO, the Batalha Monastery, or Convent of Santa Maria da Vitória, is one of the most magnificent architectural jewels in Portugal, and it is also the most significant symbol of the Avis Dynasty.

King João I, Master of Avis, ordered that it be built in thanksgiving for the victory in the Battle of Aljubarrota which ended the difficult crisis of 1383-85, and construction began in 1388, led by Master Afonso Domingues.

Nowadays, the Batalha Monastery is the main final Gothic monument in Portugal and the first one where the "Manueline Art" was applied.



In 1402, the Flaming Gothic influence emerged with Master Huguet who was put in charge of the Monastery's construction work, which brought a breath of fresh air to the structure with the beginning of the construction of the Chapter House's vault, the Founder's Chapel and the Unfinished Chapels (king D. Duarte's pantheon).

Later on, the D. Afonso V Cloister was built (by Fernão de Évora) and the cloister's galleries were closed.

The Monastery's construction was interrupted abruptly, possibly due to the construction of other important monuments, such as the Belém Monastery, and it was only given the proper restoration attention around 1840, when much conservation and restoration work was begun, which lasted many years.
